Health Insurance

Arkansans who may have recently lost job-based health insurance are eligible for a Special Enrollment Period to enroll in a Health Marketplace qualifying health plan (QHP): The loss of

job-based insurance is considered a 'qualifying life event' under the Affordable Care Act and triggers a special enrollment period for a Marketplace plan. The Arkansas Insurance Department has a toll-free number available for Arkansans eligible for special enrollment where licensed Navigators can provide assistance. SNAP & Medicaid

There are several ways you can apply for SNAP Food Stamp Program & Medicaid

1. Log on to www.accessarkansas.gov. Online is the quickest way to apply
2. Download an application from the Samaritan Community Center website www.samcc.org/resources and mail or leave the application in a drop box at your local DHS office
3. Call Samaritan Community Center 479-636-4198 and ask for a mailed SNAP application.

Economic Impact Payment

If you provided your direct deposit information on your 2018 or 2019 income tax return, then the IRS has your information and your stimulus check will be direct deposited into your account.

Walmart & Quest COVID-19 Testing Site

Walmart and Quest have opened up testing to ANYONE with COVID-19 symptoms, starting immediately. The testing site is located in the west parking lot of the Walmart Home Office, located at the intersection of 8th and Walton. The process remains the same, with people using the Quest app to schedule an appointment.

Who:

- Anyone who is exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 and all healthcare providers and first responders. For more information on testing eligibility please see CDC guidelines:<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/downloads/priority-testing-patients.pdf>.
- You must first qualify for COVID-19 screening and schedule an appointment at:www.MyQuestCOVIDTest.com

When:

- The drive-thru will be open daily from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., weather permitting.
- Please arrive no more than 10 minutes before your appointment time.

- Walmart Home Office parking lot: **702 SW 8th Street, Bentonville, AR 72716**
- **PLEASE NOTE:** Testing is not available in any Walmart store or in any Quest Diagnostics Patient Service Center

What to bring/things to note:

- The testing site will require an appointment through Quest's MyQuest™ online portal and app. You will receive an appointment confirmation that you will need to have on hand when you arrive on-site.
- In addition, please make sure to bring your insurance card and valid photo ID for proof of identity.
- Those being tested will need to stay in their cars for verification of eligibility criteria, ID check and sample self-collection. For the safety of all those on-site, the test site is not able to service those who walk up.
